#### Stephen E. Finn, Ph.D.



Texas, USA is a Clinical Associate Professor of Psychology at the University of Texas at Austin, and Senior Researcher and Director of Training at the European Center for Therapeutic Assessment at Catholic University of Milan, Italy. He has published 90+ articles and chapters on psychological assessment, psycho- diagnosis, and other topics in clinical psychology. He is the co-author of two recent books, Therapeutic Assessment with Adults and Therapeutic Assessment with Children, both published by Routledge in 2022. Dr. Finn is the recipient of the 2011 Bruno Klopfer Award from the Society of Personality Assessment, for his distinguished lifetime contributions to the field of

personality assessment. Among his other awards is the Carl Rogers Award for distinguished contributions to humanistic psychology, presented by Division 32 of the American Psychological Association in 2018.

Noriko Nakamura, Ph.D.



Noriko Nakamura, Ph.D. Clinical Director of the Asian-Pacific Center for Therapeutic Assessment is a clinical psychologist who has been working with psychological assessment and psychotherapy for over 30 years as co-director of the Nakamura Psychotherapy Institute. Dr. Nakamura is well known for practicing and applying Rorschach Feedback Sessions in her psychotherapy. She is on the boards of the International Rorschach Society and of the Therapeutic Assessment Institute. She was the founder and former President of the Japan Society for the Comprehensive System (2003-2014) and a professor at Soka Graduate University (2000-2005). Dr. Nakamura is the author of many publications on the Rorschach Comprehensive System and other topics in psychological assessment, and she lectures frequently around the world.
